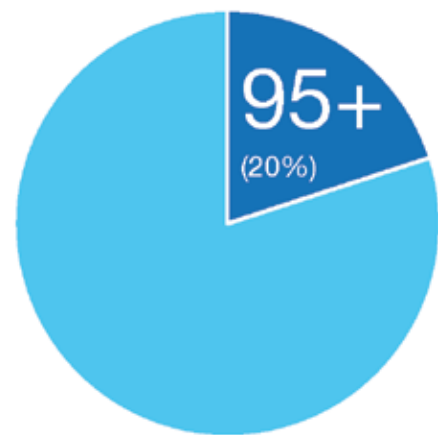
OUR INTERNATIONAL STUDENT PROGRAM

They experience the creative and exciting learning journey the school community offers whilst working towards their Victorian Certificate of Education.

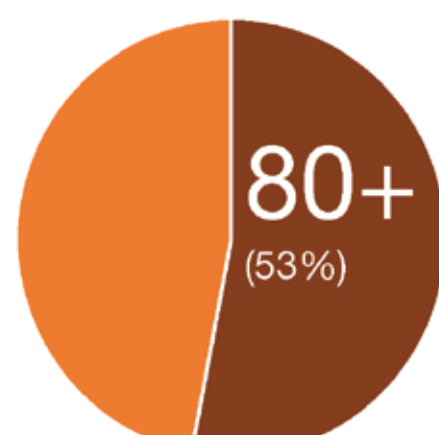
2020 RESULTS AND DESTINATIONS



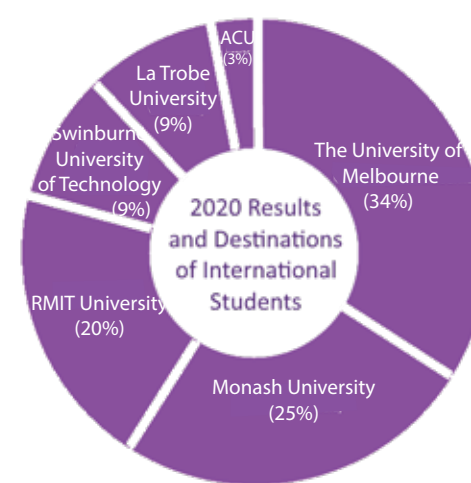
20% of students earned an ATAR 95+

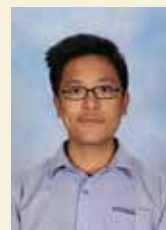
Kiarash Nikoo - 2018
